Day 42 (Friday, 10/31/08) At Sea, Halloween

Losses suffered by the Japanese during the battle of the Coral Sea led to the defeat of the Japanese at Midway Island a short while later. This began the Japanese retreat which was slow at first but ended with their surrender in 1945.
